Message from the Headteacher

We are all looking forward to welcoming many of our Year 11 parents on Wednesday next week for our first in-person Sixth Form Open Evening since autumn 2019. The event will run from 4:30 - 7:30pm, with ticketed headteacher's talks at 5:00 and 6:15pm. We have put additional tickets for these talks on Eventbrite after the first batches were all allocated and these can be reserved via the link on the school website. On Wednesday all students will be dismissed from school at 12:20pm and years 7 - 11 will be set an assignment as part of our 'Sea of Stories' reading project for this term. On Thursday 14th October school will begin at the normal time for all students, with gates opening at 8:35am as usual.

Our vaccination roll-out at the end of last week and beginning of this week ran very smoothly and I am very grateful to all our staff members who worked alongside the NHS team to deliver the vaccination programme so efficiently. Our students behaved impeccably and were incredibly sensible throughout the whole process. For families whose children have not been vaccinated but would now like them to be, we are currently in discussions with the borough about a catch-up vaccination programme. I will pass on any information about this as soon as I receive it.

EVOLVEclubs - Extracurricular Activity Offer

Parents have received an email with details of how to access their accounts on the EVOLVE system. EVOLVE is our new planning and management system for extracurricular activities and clubs system, it enables parents to electronically sign up their child to attend an extracurricular club or activity. Once **signed up to the system**, parents can view the extracurricular timetable for their child's year group and simply click on a club/activity link to **sign up** and secure a place for their child to attend that club or activity.

This will automatically **register a place** for your child for this activity or club across a scheduled period of time, typically, clubs or activities will span 6 sessions across a half term. There will of course be limited places available for each club/activity. The system does generate a **waiting list** for children who could not gain a place. If a student drops out from a club/activity, it will automatically inform the parent that a place has now become available. The system also generates an **electronic register** for staff running the club. It is important that students only attend activities that they have signed up for. Students will not be able to attend if they do not appear on electronic registers.

The vast majority of clubs and activities are free to attend but some clubs and activities may have a charge. Payments for charged clubs/activities need to be paid for in advance of attendance using **ParentPay**. Clubs are scheduled to start running from the week commencing **Monday 4th October**. Most clubs run for one hour. If students are attending **sports activities** they must bring along appropriate **EPHS PE kit**.

We hope this new system will make it easier for parents and students to track and engage with extra-Curricular clubs and activities. We encourage your child to sign up for some of the activities on offer and we hope they will enjoy developing a new skill or interest beyond our mainstream curriculum.

COVID-19 Guidance

We would just like to remind parents and students of DfE's and school's current guidance on COVID19 risk assessment procedures:

"Bubbles' will end for all children under 18, social distancing will no longer be necessary, and schools will not need to stagger start and finish times."

To support safe arrival to and departure from school we ask that:

All students should arrive at 8:35 for an 8:45 start (tutor period starts) and period 5 will end at 14:55.

- Years 7, 9 & 11 must use the Westlea Road gate and will have 'early' breaks and lunchtimes
- Years 8, 10, 12 & 13 must use the Vicarage Lane gate and will have 'late' breaks and lunchtimes

We will keep the separate Year group zones for breaks and lunchtime play and recreation.

2. "close contacts will be identified via NHS Test and Trace and education settings will no longer be expected to undertake contact tracing."

Since 19th July NHS Test & Trace take responsibility for contact tracing and will contact you if your child is a close contact of a confirmed case.

3. "face coverings will no longer be advised for pupils, staff and visitors either in classrooms or in communal areas."

The current advice from our Local authority is that masks are still 'strongly encouraged' and I believe that we should continue to follow that advice.

We will keep you informed of any other government changes. Full guidance and a copy of the school's risk assessment can be found on the school website.

We would like to pass on thanks from the NHS team who were in earlier this week vaccinating students. They were extremely impressed by their positive behaviour and maturity throughout the process.

Home Coronavirus Testing

Please remember to continue your twice weekly testing at home. If you are symptomatic, you must get a lab PCR test from the NHS. You must not use a LFD test in these cases and must get a PCR test. Results from the school issued rapid coronavirus test kits should continue to be recorded on the school database using the test bag id and on the NHS system using the QR code on the test cartridge. Please remember to use the test bag ID associated with the box that that test came from so we can continue to automatically issue new kits where needed.
