Year 10 Work Experience Programme 2024

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- •5 day placement
- Monday 15th 19th July 2024
- Process intends to purposefully mimic a real life job application
- Students have been given support in writing a CV, cover letter and how to contact employers
- Use local networks (friends, family, contacts from EWOD days / chatting to teachers).
- Year 10 CIEAG programme supports students in being ready for their placement including mock interviews, university life workshops, PSHCE preparing for WEX lessons, reflection booklet to complete

'Paper'work:

 Students complete a handwritten form to give to form tutors – this must be signed and gives the school official confirmation of parent consent



- Students complete an online form which goes through to the Educational Development Trust who then complete a thorough risk assessment and will contact employers directly
- Once a student's placement has been confirmed, we will issue them with a placement letter

Timeline:

- Deadline for finding placements is January 12th and RA will commence
- Students without a placement will be contacted
- Students without a placement by February half term will be assigned a placement in school
- Please encourage students to keep looking....

FAQs & Lessons learnt



1. My child is on the Berlin Trip, can they still do WEX?

Yes but we must keep disruption to the curriculum at a minimum. Therefore, please arrange for school holidays. Alternative experiences in school can be linked to key employability skills and will also include "meaningful interactions" with employers

2. My child's placement is unable to provide an employer insurance liability number as they are under 16:

We may be able to authorise this placement through a LOA request from the parent however this will need to be discussed with ACR.

3. My child cannot find a placement:

We have had varying levels of success sourcing placements for students and, with the ethos of WEX in mind, want to avoid this. If any placements become available, we will notify the year group and students will be able to apply for them directly through the school. Students may be accommodated in school for the specified dates. Students have been provided with a list of previous employers and SMHW task refreshed today.


