


Orphan Monster Spy by Matt Killeen

Survive. Deceive. Resist.


They think she is just a little girl. But she is the weapon they never saw coming ... with a mission to destroy them all.



White Rabbit, Red Wolf by Tom Pollock




Run Riot by Nikesh Shukla
