

Getting on the Bus

- Wait until the bus doors open fully.
- It is good manners to let anyone who is getting off the bus step off first.
- Climb up the steps holding on to the handle.

Finding a Space

- Find a safe space on the bus and make sure that your bags are tucked away to avoid tripping someone up.

Bus Behaviour



- When you are on the bus, the driver needs to concentrate.
- You should stay in your seat without distracting them.
- This will make the journey safe for everyone.

Leaving the Bus



- Press the bell once before your stop.
- When the bus has stopped, you can hold onto the handrail and leave the bus.
- Remember to say thank you to your bus driver!

Getting into the Car

- Carefully climb into the car from the pavement side.
- You should only open and close the car door when an adult tells you that it is safe to do so.



Car Safety



- Everybody in the car needs to wear a seatbelt.

Car Safety



- In a car, you should never open the door or window without permission.
- Some cars have special locks to stop children from opening doors and windows.

Car Behaviour



- In a car, the driver has to concentrate on the road ahead. You should stay in your seat.
- Remember that the driver needs to be able to hear what is happening around them so it is important that you behave sensibly.
